Weekday Mass in Eastertide

The Greeting

Priest ✠ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
All **Amen.**

The Lord be with you.
All **And also with you.**

Alleluia! Christ is risen.
All **He is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

The priest introduces the liturgy and invites us to confess our sins.

Lord, have mercy.
All **Lord, have mercy.**

Christ, have mercy.
All **Christ, have mercy.**

All **Lord, have mercy.**

The Priest says a prayer for forgiveness, to which we respond
All **Amen.**

The Gloria in Excelsis is said during the Octave of Easter and on feast days. Otherwise, Mass continues with the Opening Prayer.

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father. We worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Opening Prayer

The Priest says the prayer for the day

The Reading

This is the Word of the Lord.
All **Thanks be to God.**

A psalm follows the reading. Please join in the response.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia!
The verse for the day is said

All **Alleluia!**

The Holy Gospel

The Lord be with you.
All **And also with you.**
Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N.*
All **Glory to you, O Lord.**

After the Gospel

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
All **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Prayer of Intercession

After each petition will be said

Lord, in your mercy.
All **Hear our prayer.**

or

Lord, hear us.
All **Lord, graciously hear us.**

Following the prayers for the departed

Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord
All **And let light perpetual shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.**

A Prayer for our Parishes

**God our Father,
through your Holy Spirit
you grow your Church
as we proclaim the kingdom of your risen Son.
Bless us with deepening faith
and an increase in our community.
Help us to be a beacon of your love to everyone we meet.
We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.**

The prayers conclude with

Merciful Father,
All **accept these prayers for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.**

The Peace

The Priest introduces the Peace, and then says

The peace of the Lord be always with you.
All **And also with you.**

The Preparation of the Gifts

Bread and wine are placed on the altar, symbols of God's creation. The Priest praises God for these gifts, to which we respond

All **Blessed be God for ever.**

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that this our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.
All **May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name; for our good and the good of all his Church.**

The Priest says the Prayer over the Gifts

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you.
All **And also with you.**
Lift up your hearts.
All **We lift them to the Lord.**
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
All **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

At the end of the Preface we say

All **Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

The Priest recalls the Last Supper and calls on God's Holy Spirit to change the gifts of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ.

Great is the mystery of faith:
All **Christ has died:
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.**

or

Praise to you, Lord Jesus:
All **Dying you destroyed our death,
Rising you restored our life:
Lord Jesus, come in glory.**

As the Eucharistic Prayer continues we recall the death and resurrection of Jesus, and plead his sacrifice before the Father. The Prayer ends with a doxology and we give our acclamation:

All **Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

The Priest invites us to join in the Lord's Prayer

All **Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

The Priest breaks the consecrated bread and says

 We break this bread to share in the Body of Christ.
All **Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

Agnus Dei

All **Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.
Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.
Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, grant us peace.**

The Invitation to Communion

The Priest invites us to receive a spiritual Communion

 This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.
 Blessed are those who are called to his supper.
All **Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

and we say together

**My Jesus, I believe that you
are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
I love you above all things,
and I desire to receive you into my soul.
Since I cannot at this moment
receive you sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.
I embrace you as if you were already there
and unite myself wholly to you.
Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.**

The priest and people now receive communion

The Priest says the Post Communion Prayer

Blessing and Dismissal

The Lord be with you.

All **And also with you.**

May almighty God bless you, the Father, ✠ and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

All **Amen.**

Go in the peace of Christ. Alleluia, alleluia!

All **Thanks be to God. Alleluia, alleluia!**

The Regina Coeli

This ancient prayer, dating back to the 13th century, is an Easter greeting to Mary, mother of the Lord, who with us worships her risen Son. It may be said before or after Mass.

Joy to thee, O Queen of Heaven: **alleluia!**

He whom thou wast meet to bear: **alleluia!**

As he promised hath arisen: **alleluia!**

Pour for us to God thy prayer: **alleluia!**

Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia:
for the Lord is risen indeed, alleluia!

Let us pray:

O God, who by the resurrection of thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ hast brought joy to the whole world; grant that through his Mother, the Virgin Mary, we may obtain the joys of life everlasting. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
